

Each week children will be expected to:

- read reading book at least three times per week (extra reading is also encouraged)
- practise counting forwards and backwards to 20 so that they have fluent recall
- PE KIT Our PE day is Monday. All children are expected to do PE unless they have a
 medical note. PE kit is: plain coloured t-shirt (house colour), black or blue shorts or tracksuit pants and trainers/plimsolls. Please ensure that a kit is labelled and stored in a
 drawstring bag. It should be left in school for the half term when it will be returned
 home to wash to be brought back at the start of the new term.
- **WELLIES**—Please provide your child with a pair of named wellies that can stay in school until the end of the year. This is for when the children are in the outdoor area.
- **WATER BOTTLE**—We encourage children to drink water throughout the day. Please ensure that their bottle is washed daily and refilled with fresh water. Juice is not permitted.
- **TOYS** -We ask that no toys/ cuddly toys are brought in to school unless it is a toy day. This is to stop toys getting lost or broken.
